Early Kentucky Courts

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Our ancestors often utilized the judicial systems to resolve conflicts and make estate judgments. Finding court records for your family and neighbors can provide a wealth of information for your research. Understanding the arrangements of court records can help you find the right documents.

The two major types of court cases are criminal and civil. Trials in both criminal and civil cases are generally conducted the same way.

Criminal cases involve the commission of acts that are prohibited by law and are punishable by probation, fines, imprisonment, or death. The attorney representing the state, county or municipal government that formally accuses an individual of committing a crime is the prosecutor. The party charged with the crime is the defendant.

Steps in a Criminal Case: 1. Arrest, 2. Initial Appearance, 3. Preliminary Hearing, 4. Arraignment, 5. Trial - Opening Statements – Depositions – Witnesses – Jury Deliberations – Verdict.

Appeals: A convicted defendant may appeal. In a case where the death penalty is imposed, an automatic appeal is filed with the State Supreme Court. In all other criminal cases, the appeal goes to the court of appeals.

Civil cases typically involve legal disagreements between individuals, businesses, corporations or partnerships. A person can also be involved in a civil lawsuit with a government entity such as a state, county or city. Most civil cases involve disputes related to breach of contract, the collection of a debt, monetary compensation for personal injuries, property damage, or family law issues such as divorce. The party suing in a civil case is the plaintiff, and the party being sued is the defendant.

Steps in a Civil Lawsuit:

1. The plaintiff files a document (complaint) with the clerk of the court stating the reasons why the plaintiff is suing the defendant, and what action the plaintiff wants the court to take.

2. The plaintiff must state whether the case is eligible for arbitration according to court rule.

3. A copy of the complaint and a summons are delivered to (served on) the defendant.

4. The defendant has a limited time to file a written answer admitting or denying the statements in the complaint.

5. The plaintiff and the defendant exchange information about the case. This is called discovery.

6. The case is tried before a jury or a judge.

7. The judge makes a decision, or the jury gives its verdict, based on the testimony and other evidence presented during trial.

8. The losing party may appeal the decision to the next higher level of the court.

1780: County Courts initially had county-wide jurisdiction over all records of civil and criminal cases. Later these courts recorded deeds, bonds, probates, and juvenile matters.

After 1852 most criminal cases were handled by circuit or quarterly courts.

1787–1802: Courts of quarter sessions heard suits involving large amounts of money.

1787: Circuit courts have county-wide jurisdiction over major civil and criminal cases, divorces, and appeals from inferior courts. Courts were divided into various types depending upon the cases presented.

1787: Quarterly courts have county-wide jurisdiction over minor criminal cases.

Other courts include the justice's court, court of over and terminer, court of appeals, examining court, and general court.

Supreme Court - The District of Kentucky of the Commonwealth of Virginia was created in 1783. Cases could be appealed to the Virginia Court of Appeals. This Court was abolished in 1792 when Kentucky became a state. The Kentucky Supreme Court was recreated in 1976.

Court of Appeals (1792-1976)

The current format of the Kentucky Court of Appeals was created in 1976 when the state's highest court became the new Supreme Court. The new Court of Appeals has fourteen judges, two from each of the seven Court of Appeals districts. An appeal may be taken to the Court of Appeals from any conviction, final judgment, order, or decree in any case in circuit court, unless such conviction, final judgment, order, or decree was rendered on an appeal from a court inferior to circuit court.

RG21 Record Group 21 - District Courts of the United States

Established: As elements of the federal court system by the Judiciary Act of 1789 (1 Stat. 76), September 24, 1789, pursuant to Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution, which granted to Congress power "To constitute Tribunals inferior to the supreme Court," and Article III, Section 1, which vested judicial power in the Supreme Court "and such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish." Individual district courts, minimally one for each state, established by specific legislation serve as the trial courts of general federal jurisdiction.

In addition to U.S. district courts, this record group includes the records of U.S. territorial courts, U.S. circuit courts, and Confederate States district courts. Jurisdiction includes criminal cases, tort suits by aliens, common law and equity suits involving the United States, suits involving an alien, and suits between citizens of different states. Appellate jurisdiction was transferred from circuit courts to courts of appeals by the Judiciary Act of 1891 (26 Stat. 826).
